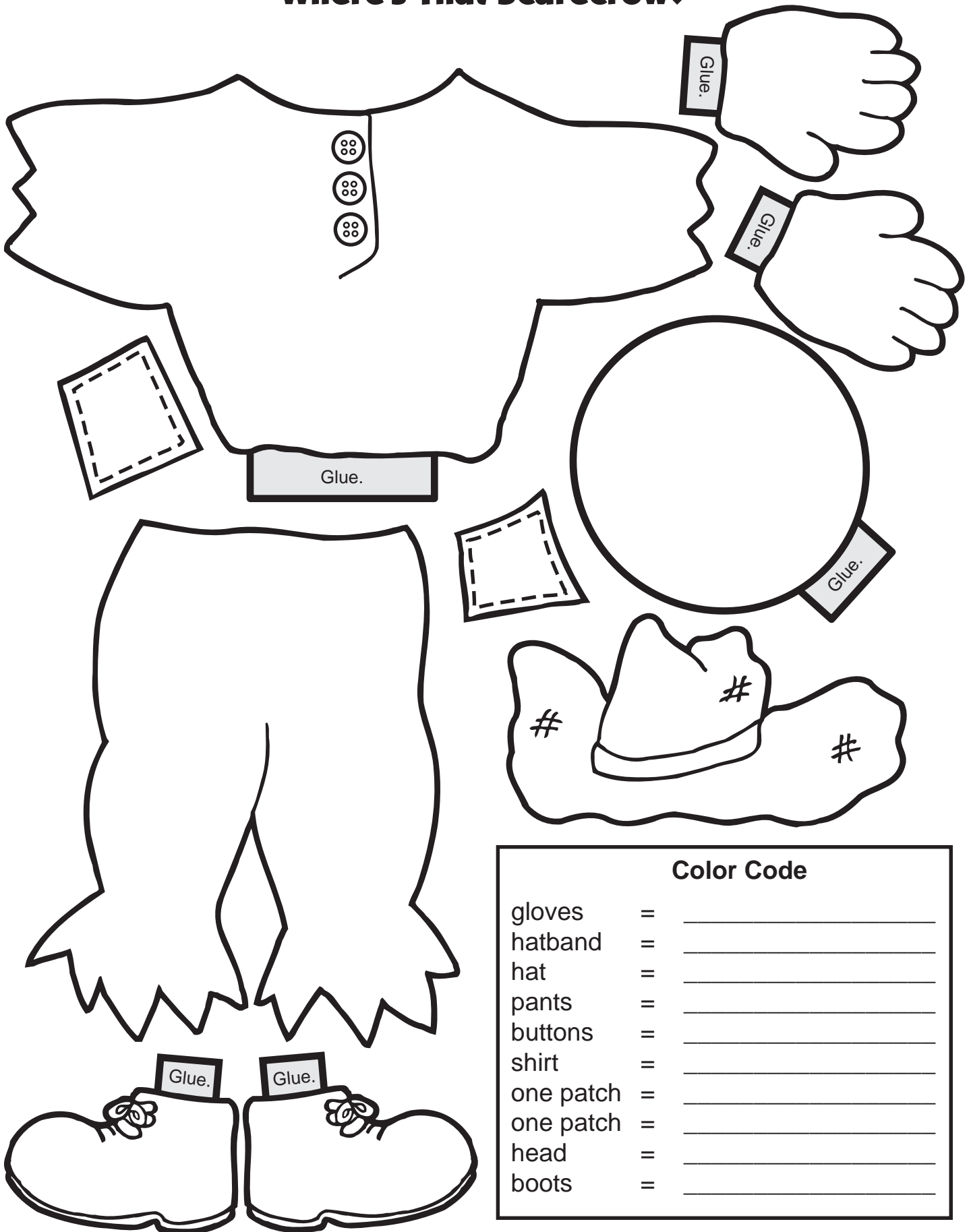

Materials Needed For Each Student

- a white construction-paper copy of the reproducible
- a pencil
- crayons
- scissors
- glue
- a drinking straw or two wooden craft sticks
- a tablespoon of clay
- scraps of yellow construction paper (optional)
- tape

How To Use The Reproducible

1. Ask each child to complete the color code by copying ten different crayon colors in the blanks.
2. Have each child trade papers with a partner, then color the patterns using the code his partner created.
3. After the students have returned the papers to their original owners, have each student add desired facial features to the head pattern.
4. Instruct students to cut out the pattern pieces and glue them together to create a scarecrow. Students may wish to add yellow construction-paper straw poking from the sleeves, pant legs, and hats of their scarecrows.
5. Have each student lay his resulting scarecrow facedown, then glue or tape a drinking straw or two wooden craft sticks end-to-end so that the device extends beneath the scarecrow's boots (see the illustration).
6. Have each student insert the end of the straw or craft stick into a small amount of clay attached to his desk or to the top of a classroom bookshelf.
